SO, WE'RE ONLINE?

PARTICIPATION

If at all possible, set aside 1-2 hours without interruption during the time you would have had class. Dedicate this time to focusing on meetings and Zoom classes. The tutors in RESOURCES offer Virtual Time Management coaching to assist you in this transition.

CANVAS

Familiarize yourself **HERE** with Canvas, where instructors host Zoom meetings, post announcements, run online discussions, etc.. If you have a smartphone, download the Canvas App (free) and turn on notifications to stay aware of course changes. Learn **HERE** how to submit assignments on Canvas.

MOBILE, LAPTOPS, & WEBCAMS

You can read **HERE** about the basic browser requirements to run Canvas; read **HERE** about the basic laptop requirements to run Canvas; read **HERE** about the basic functions in Canvas available in the app if you are without a laptop. Email your instructor the first week of class if you do not have access to any of these three options and have not had success after visiting the below resources page for acquiring technology and/or receiving online support.

G SUITE & MICROSOFT OFFICE

Set up your Google UW, or G Suite account **HERE**. Many instructors use G Suite as much, if not more than, Canvas, Zoom, and Panopto. The UW also offers the Microsoft 365 Pro suite at no cost (valued over \$300) for faculty and students. Expect to create and share Word Documents, Powerpoints, and related files from Microsoft Office 365 office. Installation and how-to is linked **HERE**.

TIME ZONE

If you are not in Pacific Standard Time, communicate this as early to your professor as possible. Help them remember by changing your time zone in Canvas settings (how-to is **HERE**). TIP: ask the instructor who is in your time zone. The instructor can connect you as a Canvas group for support.

EMAIL & NETIQUETTE

Check your UW email twice a day and plan ahead for Online Discussions. Netiquette Pointers:

- **Use your @uw.edu email.** It is possible it will otherwise be filtered as spam or simply not go through. This is also where instructors can email you.
- **Use this NETIQUETTE GUIDE** for both Online Discussion Boards and Emails.
- **Responses may take 24 hours+** as we all make this transition. Time questions accordings.
- Introduce your name and course number. If possible, include your course section.
- **First, ask yourself these questions (below).** Your instructors themslves are also experimenting with and adapting to online. These checkpoints ensure quick, helpful answers:
 - * Have I checked the Syllabus?
 - * Have I asked a classmate?
 - * Would UW IT or resources on the Student Resources page more likely know?
