- Each course must have a grade of <u>2.0 or above.</u>

English Language Arts (ELA) Endorsement Complete Description

A completed endorsement is required before beginning the UW College of Education's Teacher Education Program (TEP). Matriculated UW students can complete an ELA endorsement during their undergraduate studies. *A completed endorsement is not equivalent to earning a BA in English, nor is by itself a teaching credential.*

ENDORSEMENT REQUIREMENTS 50 credits from the following four categories:

- 1. LINGUISTICS/ENGLISH LANGUAGE STUDY (5 Credits)
 - a. Linguistics Foundations: ENGL 370, LING 200, or LING 400
- 2. COMPOSITION THEORY & RHETORIC (10 credits)

- 4. **ELECTIVE** (5 credits): Any additional course above or a different course, pending adviser approval.

In addition to fulfilling the coverage areas above, students must also meet these requirements:

- At least 20 credits must be at the 300 or 400-level.
 - Community college transfer courses are all considered as lower-division and cannot apply.
- Each course must have a grade of 2.0 or above.
- At least one course must focus on pre-1700 literature. This requirement can overlap with another, in which case an additional 5 credit elective would be required. *Currently, no other overlaps are allowed.*

Applicants do not have to have their endorsement completed by the application due date, but endorsements must be complete before the MIT/TEP start date. Any changes in courses after the application is submitted are subject to re-approval by advisers and MIT/TEP admissions. *A completed endorsement does not guarantee admission to UW's MIT/TEP program.*
